**Session 4: Insights from Latin America – with Rafael Luciani**

**THE FEAST OF ST PETER AND PAUL 29<sup>TH</sup> JUNE:** Because St Peter recognised that God was acting through Jesus, he was entrusted with the job of leading the early Church community, along with the other Apostles and Disciples male and female. The Church today is a testimony to Peter's faith, existing because Peter and others like him trusted and believed in Jesus Christ as the Risen Son of God. They lived and acted out their faith despite hostilities and persecution. We might not in this country suffer persecution for what we believe in, but we face different sorts of problems instead. We face lethargy, conflicting secular values, and the complexities of scientific debate. The Church cannot be silenced. The challenge for us is to live out our faith in an honest and mature fashion and not be cowed by the pressures of these conflicting values.

**LINKED WITH THIS FEAST OF ST PETER + SAINT PAUL IS "PETER'S PENCE".** There is a **SECOND COLLECTION** taken at all Masses and Services next weekend. It is a universal charitable collection (called "Peter's Pence: Peter being the 1st Pope) taken every year by the Catholic Church around the world and used by the Pope in his worldwide humanitarian efforts. Victims from natural disasters, wars, diseases and other catastrophic events receive assistance from Peter's Pence. Please give what you can afford.
