"Since the year 2000 (and prior to that many years before), the present SVP Conference based in Holyhead has helped numerous individuals / families in need and has made (and continues to make) visits to the lonely and isolated on more than 2000 occasions and we continue to receive generous donations from parishioners towards helping those in need. Sadly, after 23 years, the conference in Holyhead is close to closing due to lack of members. The decline has taken place over the last few years and is mainly due to age of members and declining health / ability to visit beneficiaries. However, as a direct result of the recent meeting in Oriel Ynys Mon to discuss Island wide issues and priorities, we have an ideal opportunity to make changes and move to an Island wide SVP conference. A few individuals from Holyhead, Llangefni, Amlwch and Beaumaris have already shown interest and I believe that we have the seeds of something new and exciting for the future.

Over the Summer, there will be leaflets and posters available for parishioners and the wider community to learn about the work of the SVP and to inform individuals how their talents and skills can be put to use 'to seek and find those who are forgotten and to turn our concern into action'. There will be a number of information sessions after masses in September to encourage people to join in and help those in need in their local communities. JOINT PLEDGE BY CHURCHES ON WELSH SHRINE

The Catholic Bishop of Wrexham, Peter Brignall and the Anglican Bishop of St Asaph, Gregory Cameron, have signed a pledge to develop the ancient shrine of St Winefride at Holywell as an "integrated place of worship, pilgrimage and tourism". A place of pilgrimage since 1115, the Flintshire shrine comprises a well of holy water. According to legend, this rose from the ground where St Winefride's head fell after Caradoc, a Welsh prince beheaded her for spurning his advances. Her uncle, St Beuno, later restored Winefride's head and she led a holy life near Denbigh, becoming known as "the Welsh Lazarus". To this day visitors may bathe in the waters and attend Mass at St Winefride's parish in Holywell.
