Some of this money will be used to alleviate the suffering of people caught up in the earthquakes on the Turkey/Syria border. This collection for CAFOD is ongoing: Three Lenten Lunches to come, plus the money from the Social (Line-Dancing) evening last weekend.

THE ISLAND MISSION GROUP (IMG) are away this weekend at the Retreat House of Noddfa in Penmaenmawr. This group consists of representatives from our 7 Faith Communities on Anglesey (Amlwch, Benllech, Holyhead, Rhosneigr, Beaumaris, Llangefni, Menai Bridge) who come together regularly to discuss matters relevant to our parish life. The IMG could be likened to a Parish Council for the whole Island. They had in the past been going away annually but Covid stopped that for the past few years. They have many things to discuss, review, and implement, so let us hold them in our prayers that there may be good guidance from the Holy Spirit in all their deliberations.

ON THIS DAY (12TH MARCH) IN 1945 Anne Frank died of typhus in the concentration camp of Bergen-Belsen. She was 15 years old. A few weeks later the camp was liberated. Along with her family and four other Jews, Anne hid from the Nazis in concealed rooms in what had been her father's offices on the Prinsengracht in the city of Amsterdam, Netherland. For more than two years they were secure there, unknown to those who worked in the building, except for a friend who arranged to get food for them. They were betrayed in 1944 and all eight were sent to the death camps. Only Anne's father - Otto Frank - survived. Anne Frank's story is now known to millions across the world because of the diary that she kept about her innermost thoughts during those years in hiding. Her father discovered the diary on his return to their hiding-place, once the war ended. "The Diary of Anne Frank" has sold millions of copies and has been printed in over 50 languages. Here is an excerpt from Anne's diary dated Saturday 15th July 1944: "It's really a wonder that I haven't dropped all my ideals because they seem so absurd and impossible to carry out. Yet I keep them, because in spite of everything I still believe that people are really good at heart. I simply can't build up my hopes on a foundation consisting of confusion, misery and death. I see the world gradually being turned into a wilderness. I hear the ever approaching thunder, which will destroy us too. I can feel the suffering of millions and yet, if I look up into the heavens, I think that it will all come right, that this cruelty too will end and that peace and tranquility will return again. In the meantime, I must uphold my ideals, for perhaps the time will come when I shall be able to carry them out."
