THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT is traditionally called Laetare Sunday, a celebration very much like Gaudete Sunday in Advent. For each of those Sundays, we can use rose-coloured vestments, and both Latin words can be translated, "rejoice." Both also announce to us that we are drawing ever closer to the feast for which we are preparing (Christmas for Gaudete Sunday, and Easter for Laetare Sunday). This day has also come to be known as 'Mothering Sunday'. Many years ago, people made a point of visiting their nearest big church (the Mother Church) on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Young girls and boys 'in service' were only allowed one day to visit their family each year, and this was usually Mothering Sunday. Often the housekeeper or cook would allow the maids to bake a cake to take home for their mother. Sometimes a gift of eggs; or flowers from the garden was allowed. So today is one of the many days to show our mothers our appreciation if alive, and if not... then a thoughtful and prayerful remembrance at Mass this weekend.

Motherhood was never easy, not for Mary, not for us. There's longing in it, waiting, pain, hard work and tight budgets. But you, creating God, come that way, lighting with glory the bond of trust and humble devotion. Speak to us God, through our mothers that we may know your steadfast love.

**FAIRTRADE FORTNIGHT** is usually being celebrated at this time of year, but as it is the 30th anniversary of the Fairtrade Foundation, there will be big celebrations in September. You may have heard the phrase "Trade not Aid". Obviously aid is needed in emergency and natural disaster situations but farmers in poor countries overseas want to sell their crops for a fair price, to trade out of poverty, with health and education facilities So as we are journeying toward Easter and the great Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord, we might also be thinking .....Easter Eggs.... chocolate! So let us use our buying power to support the

farmers. Look out for the **Fairtrade Logo** which guarantees a fair price for their crops supporting them to trade out of poverty. Lidl has lots of Fairtrade chocolate and Easter eggs, Co-op has also got Fairtrade coffee, tea, bananas, sugar and wine! The core FAIRTRADE Mark is recognised around the world. An amazing 93% of UK shoppers recognise it and 83% trust it when deciding whether a product is ethical. **The FAIRTRADE Mark** is a registered certification label for products sourced from producers in lower income countries. The Mark is used only on products certified in accordance with Fairtrade Standards and on promotional materials to encourage people to buy Fairtrade products. As Fairtrade has grown, we have developed new ways to connect farmers to business to increase their Fairtrade sales, bring more Fairtrade benefits to them, and give you more ways to support Fairtrade farmers through your shopping.

A MASS OF THANKSGIVING was held in St Joseph's Church Llangefni on Thursday evening last. Everyone from all over the Island was invited and the church was full with parishioners from our six Faith Communities.
