THE CHRISTMAS SEASON ENDS THIS WEEKEND with this Sunday's Feast of the Epiphany and Monday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We leave behind the white and gold vestments and banners, the Crib and the Christmas tree, the Advent Wreath - and enter into what is known as **Ordinary Time**. The winter portion of Ordinary Time lasts but a few weeks until Ash Wednesday on 14th February. (Ordinary Time returns after Pentecost Sunday 19th May - this is the Summer Ordinary Time). We may think that this time is "ordinary" in the sense of "run of the mill". However, the term "ordinary" derives from the word "ordinal" or "numbered", because the Sundays of Ordinary Time are numerically ordered (1st Sunday in Ordinary Time, 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time etc.). The liturgical colour is green: the Mass Vestments, the Tabernacle Veil. Perhaps one of the great opportunities of Ordinary time - whether in this winter or in the summer to come - is to make our following of the Lord Jesus visible, not only through our words but also through our deeds. In this way, Ordinary Time becomes anything but ordinary!

And there are the cribs erected within the Church buildings, the Christmas trees purchased, erected and decorated. Church buildings are cleaned, flowers bought and arranged, sanctuary's decorated with taste and style, lighting and sound systems checked, heaters working (most of the time!). And because of all that we welcome so many people to the Christmas Eve and the Christmas Morning Masses, with pride in our buildings both inside and out. And you, parishioners, give to the monetary collection week by week to make all these things possible and without which we would, quite literally, be all the poorer. Besides all that there was the little Advent booklet "Walk with Me", our Advent Day Retreat, and the "Making Space" Advent Sunday Leaflets - to help us prepare for the Feast of the Nativity of the Lord. Thank you all for making it a memorable Christmas Celebration 2023!

And on the subject of thanking people, two in particular deserve mention by name: Christine Hunt and Andrew Fleming both of St Mary's Holyhead. When both Helen Doutch (Parish Secretary) and then Fr Frank ended up in hospital, Christine and Andrew stepped in immediately to "run" the Parish Office and all that that entails. They were also available, along with others, when our new priest, Fr Godfrey, arrived, to help him settle in. It was over and above what you would expect from any well run Faith Community - that people step up and take responsibility when necessary. And they did, and it was well done! So - thank you to them both, but also to the others (you know who you are!) who were behind the scenes making sure things went smoothly.

<u>A note from Fr Frank</u>: "Thank you all for the good wishes I have received over the past two months since I went into Ysbyty Gwynedd. I have been back in St Mary's Parish House for a while now, but still receiving regular treatment under the hospital who are monitoring the infection in knee and leg, as well as checking out the operation done on the knee. Walking is difficult without a crutch and managing stairs is a real challenge. But I am improving and hopefully will be back to celebrating Mass in the very near future."
