LAST WEDNESDAY – 4TH OCTOBER - the long awaited Synod began in Rome. Preparations for it have gone on for a long time, when all parishes within their diocese around the whole world were asked to meet and discuss. And on Anglesey we did just that over quite a number of meetings spanning many months. This Assembly, or Synod, has the potential to be as much a landmark moment for Catholicism as the Second Vatican Council was (1962 – 1965). There are 464 participants from all over the planet. 365 of them will be voting members with the others acting as experts, facilitators and spiritual assistants. Some 81 are women, 54 of them voting members. Pope Francis seeks to bring a revived sense of mission to the Church through this Synod, and many are hoping new life will emerge as a result. There is acknowledgement that the global Church is deeply affected by sexual, spiritual and other forms of abuse and the consequences of these need to be addressed. Some argue that the Synod will not bring about significant changes. A few are determined to make sure it fails. For Pope Francis this is a decisive moment in his personal mission to witness to the unchanging truth, that the Holy Spirit speaks to the Church in every age.

This week's Gospel is about the Kingdom of God. It is yet another simple parable or story that Jesus told his followers. Its message for each of us who hears it is profound:

Never, ever think that you can earn the Kingdom of God 'by right'. Nobody can claim a 'right' to belong to the Kingdom of God. Indeed, once we begin to think that we have earned 'a right' to it, it will be taken from us. All the things we do – praying, fasting, going to Church, denying ourselves things, none of them give us a 'right' to belong in the Kingdom. When the Kingdom of God is finally revealed on Earth, we may be very surprised by those who are at the centre of it.

This is what Jesus says to us today: "Therefore I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit."
