FOODBANK: A recent poll has revealed that in the last month, one in ten people have used a food bank. In these days of high bills and low income we are asked to look after each other, and keep an eye on those who are perhaps too proud or unused to asking for help. To do:- Help keep the foodbanks well stocked. Think about donating one item every time you visit your supermarket. There are collection points at the rear of our Churches.

SAFEGUARDING OF CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS

There will be a gathering in Holyhead Parish Hall for all those who need to renew their DBS forms (*Disclosure and Barring Service*). The Hall will be open next Saturday 28th January at 10am. It is vital that all those who have a DBS form check that it is still in date. If not, then this is your opportunity to get it renewed. The actual checking process will not take very long - so the earlier you come the quicker you will be free to go. If you have one of these certificates and it is out of date you cannot practice the particular ministry you are involved in until it is renewed. Eucharistic Minsters, Bereavement Visitors and Funeral Ministers are all required to have an up to date form. Those that come along to renew will need ID Passport, Drivers License, and a household bill with their name on it. Mary Rowlands and Karen Lewis, from the Diocesan Safeguarding Office will be in St Mary's Hall, to complete the process.

CHRISTIAN UNITY WEEK began last Wednesday 18th January and ends this coming Wednesday 25th January. For more than a century it has been celebrated every year by Christians of all Churches and ecclesial communities in order to invoke the extraordinary gift for which the Lord Jesus himself prayed at The Last Supper, before his Passion "that they may all be one; even as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they may also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:21). The practice of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was introduced in 1908 by Fr Paul Wattson, the founder of an Anglican religious community who later entered the Catholic Church, The initiative received the blessing of Pope Benedict XV, who encouraged its celebration



throughout the Catholic Church in February 1916. The Octave of Prayer was developed and perfected in the 1930s by Abbé Paul Couturier of Lyons, who supported the prayer "for the unity of the Church as Christ wants her and in conformity with the instruments that he desires". His last writings show that Abbé Couturier saw this Week as a means which enables Christ's universal prayer "to enter and penetrate the entire Body of Christians"; it must grow until it becomes "an immense, unanimous cry of the entire People of God" asking God for this great gift. Moreover the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is in itself one of the most effective expressions of the impetus the Second Vatican Council gave to the search for full communion among all Christ's disciples. May this spiritual event that unites Christians of all traditions increase our awareness that the true unity for which we strive cannot be solely the result of our own efforts but, rather, will be a gift from on high , to be ceaselessly prayed for.
