HOLYHEAD PARISH COUNCIL met on Wednesday evening and made the decision that there be one Mass at the weekend in St Mary's rather than the two at present. This Mass will be on a Sunday morning at 10.30am. St Therese, Rhosneigr will have Mass on Saturday evenings at 6pm. This new schedule will begin on Saturday evening 22nd April for Rhosneigr and Sunday morning 23rd for Holyhead. It was decided not to implement this change until after the Easter Weekend (keeping the Saturday night Easter Vigil in St Mary's), as well as giving plenty of time for the reorganisation of persons who carry out various roles in Liturgy. But the following weekend 15th/16th April is a Service of Word and Holy Communion for Holyhead/Rhosneigr. There is a desire to begin this new chapter in our faith journey by beginning it with a celebration of Mass. So that is why the weekend of 22nd/233d April has been chosen. It is sad that the Saturday evening Mass is finishing after all the years, but it was felt by the Parish Council that our one Mass should be held in Holyhead on a Sunday morning. The core group of Parishioners in Rhosneigr have been very generous in saying they will fit in with whatever the Parish Council decided.

Most of the stories from that time concentrate on events in Ireland itself but what people don't know is that Holyhead played an important role on this road to Irish independence. This lecture will cast fresh light on the events of 1912-1923 with Prof. Catherine Duigan (Aberystwyth University) and Dr. Gareth Huws explaining what was happening in Ireland and showing why Holyhead was so important. World Day of the Sick: Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes:11th February. "Illness is part of our human condition. Yet, if illness is experienced in isolation and abandonment, unaccompanied by care and compassion, it can become inhumane. When we go on a journey with others, it is not unusual for someone to feel sick, to have to stop because of fatigue or of some mishap along the way. It is precisely in such moments that we see how we are walking together: whether we are truly companions on the journey, or merely individuals on the same path, looking after our own interests and leaving others to "make do". For this reason, on the thirty-first World Day of the Sick, as the whole Church journeys along the synodal path, I invite all of us to reflect on the fact that it is especially through the experience of vulnerability and illness that we can learn to walk together according to the style of God, which is closeness, compassion, and tenderness."
